Public Benefit:

Purpose: The purpose of the program is to educate the public of the importance of vaccines and vaccine-preventable diseases. Parents of children that are not immune to certain diseases will receive information about issues related to having a non-immune child including how to recognize and respond to an exposure, how to prevent their child from contracting the diseases and what to expect in the case of an outbreak.

Services: The services provided include: An online education service that provides information about vaccines and vaccine-preventable disease to parents in a format that can be easily accessed over the Internet. Completion of the module by parents will allow state and local health departments to track the number of those seeking vaccine exemptions.

Expected Outcome: The expected outcomes are: Parents of non-immune children will access to the information they need to understand vaccines and vaccine-preventable disease to protect their children and prevent the spread of disease.

Implementations and Resources: Utah Department of Health will implement and maintain a module prepared by the Summit Group (see fiscal note for explanation).

How: The proposed activities of the Department will include: A. Maintenance of the educational module. B. Administrative oversight for needed changes within the module.
