For every additional class A misdemeanor conviction processed under this bill, \$350 could be generated for the General Fund and \$630 for the Criminal Surcharge Account. The total number of cases is unknown.

Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

For every additional class A misdemeanor offense processed under this bill, \$350 could be generated for local governments. Counties could also incur costs of about \$65/day for each additional offender housed in county jails. The total number of cases is unknown.

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Certain offenders could pay about \$1,330 in fines for these class A misdemeanor offense. The total number of cases is unknown.
