This legislation appropriates \$9,800 from the General Fund beginning in FY 2018 to the Department of Public Safety - Bureau of Criminal Investigation to operate a suicide prevention education course, provide posters, and manage a grant program for federally licensed firearm dealers. Funds not expended through operational costs, anticipated to be approximately \$2,800 of the \$9,800 appropriation, could be granted to federally licensed firearm dealers to provide suicide prevention education opportunities to the public and dealers" employees.
