

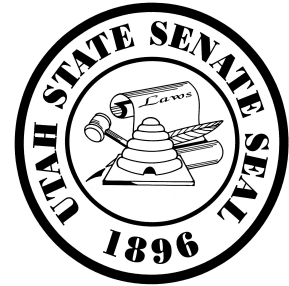

Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this legislation could increase costs to the Parks and Recreation Division from the State Parks Fees Restricted Account by \$107,500 annually as the division researches where to place Native American remains burial land in each state park. Enactment of this legislation could also cost the Department of Heritage and Arts \$30,000 ongoing General Fund beginning in FY 2018 for burial preparation and ceremonial costs.
