Enactment of this legislation will shift the Electronic High School and its estimated \$1,003,700 annual cost from the State Board of Education to the Utah Education and Telehealth Network. Funding for the Electronic High School beyond FY 2017 was eliminated from the State Board of Education budget during the 2016 General Session. If the Legislature requires UETN to continue operating the Electronic High School after FY 2017, UETN would need to absorb the \$1,003,700 ongoing cost, or the Legislature would need to appropriate \$1,003,700 from the Education Fund to UETN starting in FY 2018.
