Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Legislature \$15,700 from the General Fund approximately once every ten years beginning in FY 2021, for per diem and expense reimbursement to the nine members of the Advisory Redistricting Commission, assuming they hold ten public hearings around the State and meet ten other times. Additional staff costs are possible if the commission is authorized to hire staff beyond the technical support to be provided by the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel (OLRGC); OLRGC would experience staff costs related to redistricting with or without this legislation. The Legislature could also experience costs to publish approximately 40 notices of public hearings in newspapers around the State.
