UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Beginning in 2019, Utah educators seeking a Level I license from the State Board of Education may be required to pay fees associated with the teacher pedagogical assessment outlined in the bill. Any assessment fees will be paid to the assessment contractor selected by the State Board. The State Board issues approximately 3,200 Level I licenses a year and estimates the assessment fee to be under \$300 each. The assessment contractor could therefore receive up to \$960,000 annually.

Notes on Notes
