## Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Beginning in 2019, Utah educators seeking a Level I license from the State Board of Education may be required to pay fees associated with the teacher pedagogical assessment outlined in the bill. Depending on the assessment selected by the Board, the net cost to certain educators may increase by \$100 to \$150 for associated testing fees paid to the assessment provider as determined the Board. The Board issues approximately 3,200 Level I licenses a year.
