Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this bill could cost the Lt. Governor's Office \$870,000 from the General Fund per statewide runoff election. Assuming such an election would occur every four years, the annual cost would be \$217,500 ongoing. Other costs may occur depending on contested offices and locations. Enactment of this bill could also cost the Lt. Governor's Office \$800 one-time from the General Fund in FY 2018 (which the agency would absorb) to write new administrative rules.
