Enactment of this legislation appropriates \$500,000 ongoing General Fund to the Department of Workforce Services starting in FY 2018 to provide parental coaching and a one-time contribution of \$50 to a 529 savings account for Higher Education. Funds are distributed if at least one parent applicant successfully completes the parental coaching course. The legislation also requires an additional one-time contribution of \$50 to the 529 savings account if proof is provided that at least one parent applicant has contributed \$50 to the 529 savings account. The Department of Workforce Services estimates one-time costs to develop the application, create the program rules, and to interface with FINET and the Utah Educational Savings Plan to deliver each of the \$50 benefits to be \$171,600 one-time from the General Fund, and personnel costs to administer the program to be \$58,500 in FY 2018 and \$117,000 ongoing in FY 2019. The balance of the \$500,000 ongoing appropriation (\$269,900 in FY 2018 and \$383,000 in FY 2019) would be available for pass-through to eligible participants.

Enactment of this legislation could allow certain individuals meeting the eligibility requirements to receive payments to educational savings accounts. Qualifying individuals will receive parental coaching and a one-time contribution of \$50 to a 529 savings account for higher Education if at least one parent applicant successfully completes the parental coaching. Qualifying individuals will also receive an additional one-time contribution of \$50 to the 529 savings account if proof is provided that at least one parent applicant has contributed \$50 to the 529 savings account.
