Enactment of this legislation could cost the Department of Human Services - Division of Child and Family Services \$840,900 (\$748,500 General Fund and \$92,400 federal funds) in FY 2018 and \$79,500 (\$70,800 General Fund and \$8,700 federal funds) annually beginning in FY 2019 to expunge alleged perpetrators from supported and unsupported reports of child abuse or neglect, based on criteria determined by the division through rule. Costs in FY 2018 include computer programming to modify the division"s two information systems and assume approximately 1,100 requests for expungement; costs in subsequent years assume approximately 550 requests for expungement annually, which represents 2.6 percent of the alleged perpetrators documented in reports each year.
