Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this bill may cost the State Board of Education \$1,086,000 ongoing from the Education Fund beginning in FY 2019 to implement the provisions associated with funding foreign exchange students in the Minimum School Program. A corresponding bill, also part of the recodification of the education code, includes a savings of the same amount. Enactment of this bill may result in minimal additional costs for the State Board of Education to update administrative rules and policies for new code references. The State Board of Education indicated that they can absorb these costs.
