To the extent that individuals are fined for using unmanned aircraft systems in violation of the provisions of this bill, the criminal surcharge account could see additional revenue equal to 35 percent of the fine of \$5,000 for each third degree felony and 35 percent of the fine of \$680 for each class B misdemeanor.

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

An individual who uses an unmanned aircraft system in violation of the provisions of this bill could pay a fine of \$5,000 for a third degree felony or \$680 for a class B misdemeanor, plus a 35 percent surcharge.
