Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this bill could result in an ongoing loss of an estimate \$100 of revenue beginning in Fiscal Year 2019 for local county health departments from a reduction of emissions program fees for canal and irrigation vehicles that would be exempt under the provisions of this bill.

### Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this bill could result in an annual estimated reduction of revenue for private emission inspection stations in the amount of \$1,300 beginning in Fiscal Year 2019 with canal and irrigation vehicles being exempt under the provisions of this bill. Canal and irrigation companies would be able to save approximately \$1,400 annually due to the exemption provided in this bill.

### Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
