Enactment of this legislation could cost the Legislature \$4,200 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2019 for ten additional years of compensation of legislators on the Commission on Federalism. These costs include \$1,800 for the Senate and \$2,400 for the House of Representatives. This bill could also cost the Office of Legislative Research and General Council \$40,000 from the General Fund, one-time; the office has indicated it can absorb these costs.
