# Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Local government mental health and substance abuse services may provide ongoing match of \$140,000 for Medicaid services beginning in FY 2019. In addition, 25 local education agencies may see ongoing local costs of \$1,020,000 offset by \$710,000 federal funds obtained by providing ongoing match of \$310,000 for Medicaid-eligible medical services at school for 585 children beginning in FY 2019.
