UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this bill could increase costs for licensees by an unknown amount for the purchase and re-programming of scanners to take international ID or driver licenses. There are 626 full restaurants, 411 limited restaurants, 115 beer-only restaurants, 95 dining clubs, and 266 bars that could potentially be affected by this bill.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
