Enactment of this bill could generate about \$700 ongoing in filing fee revenue beginning in FY 2019.

About 2 court filers/year could pay about \$350/each for a total of \$700 beginning in FY 2019. To the extent that parties engage in the prohibited activity outlined in this bill, they could pay more to prevailing parties in damages, fees, and fines however the amount is indeterminable.

**Regulatory Impact**

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
