Enactment of this legislation could reduce license reinstatement revenue to the Department of Public Safety Restricted Account by \$450,500 ongoing beginning in FY 2019.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Department of Public Safety \$2,000 one-time from the Department of Public Safety Restricted Account in FY 2018 for database reprogramming, and could save the department \$33,000 ongoing from the same account beginning in FY 2019 from reduced processing workload.

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

In 2017, 6,930 suspensions did not indicate operation of a vehicle was involved. Enactment of this bill would save individuals behind those actions a \$65 reinstatement fee, for an aggregate annual savings of \$450,500.
