UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

To the extent that individuals are fined for violating provisions of this bill, the criminal surcharge account could see additional revenue equal to 35 percent of the fine of \$680 per class B misdemeanor or 35 percent of the fine of \$100 per class C misdemeanor.

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Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that individuals are convicted of class B or class C misdemeanors for violating provisions of this bill, fine revenue of \$680 (for class B) or \$100 (for class C) per occurrence could accrue to local entities. Class B and class C misdemeanors could require court processing, which could lead to increased costs for local entities.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

An individual who violates provisions of this bill could pay a fine of \$680 for a class B misdemeanor or \$100 for a class C misdemeanor plus a surcharge of 35 percent of the fine.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Notes on Notes

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
