



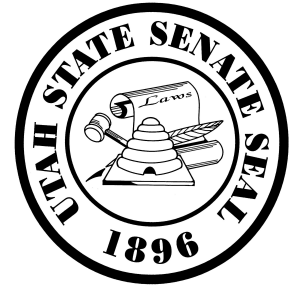

Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this bill could cost \$8,000 one-time in FY 2019 (\$4,000 from the General Fund and \$4,000 from other sources) and \$15,000 ongoing, beginning in FY 2020 (\$7,500 from the General Fund and \$7,500 from other sources for state-paid health benefits. The Public Employees Health Plan (PEHP) has indicated that above costs are absorbed within the existing rate structure. To the extent that additional survivors become eligible for this benefit, the cost for health insurance coverage is estimated at approximately \$15,000 per year per individual.
