New Services or Benefit

Public Benefit:

Purpose: The purpose of the new program is to improve student attendance and increase family engagement by creating relationships through the home visits thereby improving student academic performance and also student adaptation to school.

Services: The services provided are two home visits for a cross-section of K-3 students with at least two trained and compensated educators at each home visit.

Expected Outcome: The expected outcomes are increases in student attendance and also family engagement. The public will benefit by having a higher percentage of students prepared for college and careers.

Implementations and Resources: The bill will be implemented as outlined in it with the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) administering the grant program and identifying eligible schools. Schools who agree to participate will receive professional development training and subsequently run the home visit program. The USBE will evaluate the effect of the program.

How: By administering the program accurately and providing the professional development training for school staff, we would expect to see improvement in student attendance and increased family engagement.
