Enactment of this legislation could reduce state sales tax revenue by \$4,020,000 in FY 2019 and \$5,020,000 in FY 2020. The General Fund impact could be \$3,015,000 in FY 2019 and \$3,765,000 in FY 2020. The impact on restricted funds is estimated at \$1,005,000 in FY 2019 and \$1,255,000 in FY 2020.

Enactment of this legislation could reduce local sales tax revenue by \$1,810,000 in FY 2019 and by \$2,270,000 in FY 2020.

Enactment of this legislation could save individuals purchasing certain hygiene products \$5,830,000 in FY 2019 and \$7,290,000 in FY 2020
