UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

Enactment of this legislation will generate ongoing dedicated credits of \$18,900 beginning in FY 2019 from non-emergency secure medical transport companies.

Enactment of this bill may cost the Public Employees Health Program, and therefore multiple state agencies, \$23,300 in FY 2019 and \$40,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2020 from various sources, including \$11,800 in FY 2019 and \$20,100 ongoing from the General Fund and \$800 in FY 2019 and \$1,300 ongoing from the Education Fund, beginning in FY 2019 for increased health insurance premiums for paying emergency medical service providers rather than secure transport companies for interfacility transports. Additionally, enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Health \$18,900 ongoing from dedicated credits beginning in FY 2019 to license 20 non-emergency secure medical transport companies and inspect about 100 vehicles statewide. Finally, enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Health \$2,200 one-time in FY 2019 for 40 hours of staff time to develop rules. The Department of Health has indicated that it can absorb this \$2,200 one-time cost.

Local governments in Salt Lake County that use Public Employees' Health Program may see costs similar to the State of Utah.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this bill could lead to greater reimbursements for emergency medical service providers and reduced reimbursement levels for secure transport companies. Additionally, 20 non-emergency secure medical transport companies will pay about \$120 annually for a license and \$165 for each of about 100 vehicles statewide for inspections.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation could result in a medium increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
