By repealing the Rural Development Legislative Liaison Committee, this bill reduces ongoing General Fund costs to the Senate by \$2,300 and to the House of Representatives by \$4,000. By repealing the Constitutional Revision Commission, this bill reduces ongoing General Fund costs to the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel by \$49,700. This bill also repeals the Private Proposal Expendable Special Revenue Fund; the fund has a balance of \$7,000.
