**Local Government**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could increase costs to workers' compensation insurance carriers who insure local governments in Utah by 1.1%, or approximately \$420,000 statewide. It is not known whether such impact would be absorbed by the carriers or passed on to policy holders.

**Individuals & Businesses**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation could increase costs to workers' compensation insurance carriers by 1.1%, or approximately \$4 million statewide. It is not known whether such impact would be absorbed by the carriers or passed on to policy holders. Enactment of this legislation could increase financial benefits to dependents of insured individuals.

**Regulatory Impact**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(e)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
