Enactment of this legislation could increase revenues to the Utah State Historical Society, part of the Department of Heritage and Arts, in the amount of \$12,500 annually beginning in October 2018 (FY 2019) from a \$25 annual fee for special group license plates from approximately 500 Utah residents. If license plate production start-up costs are covered by private donations, the Tax Commission could receive \$15,000 in dedicated credits revenue.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Tax Commission \$15,000 in dedicated credit expenditures for license plate production start-up costs, assuming a private donor is willing to cover said start-up						

costs. Enactment of this legislation could cost the Utah State Historical Society \$12,500 annually beginning in October 2018 (FY 2019) in dedicated credits expenditures in the form of current expense. Utah State Historical Society expenditures are contingent on the amount of revenue collected by individuals choosing the special group license plate.
