Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Labor Commission \$50,000 from the Industrial Accident Restricted Account annually for 3 years from FY 2019 through FY 2021 to contract with a third-party to complete the three new required reports. Enactment of this legislation could also cost the Labor Commission \$200 annually beginning in FY 2019 from the General Fund for per diem costs for the additional member of the Workers' Compensation Advisory Council. The commission will absorb these costs.
