State Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

Enactment of this legislation could increase deposits to the the County of the First Class Highway Projects Fund by approximately \$2.0 million ongoing beginning in FY 2019. Enactment would shift payments in the amount of about \$5.6 million annually from the County of the First Class Highway Projects Fund that currently go to the Transportation Investment Fund of 2005 for the repayment of a \$28,079,000 loan to the Transportation Fund. Any excess in the County of the First Class Highway Projects Fund at the end of each fiscal year would be transferred to the Transportation Fund to accelerate repayment of the loan.

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Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could increase the amount of revenue from the local option highway construction and transportation corridor preservation fee for a county of the first class that is deposited into the County of the First Class Highway Projects Fund by approximately \$2.0 million in each of FY 2019 and FY 2020, and enactment could decrease the amount of fee revenue that is sent to a city of the first class within that county by those same amounts. Enactment could lead to transfers from the County of the First Class Highway Projects Fund to a public transit district in a county of the first class of approximately \$2.0 million in each of FY 2019 and FY 2020.
