New Services or Benefit

Public Benefit:

Purpose: The purposes of the new program are to develop and maintain and stroke registry and a cardiac registry as well as a stroke registry advisory committee and a cardiac registry advisory committee.

Services: The services provided by the new program will be collection and analysis of data to: analyze information on the incidence, severity, causes, outcomes, and rehabilitation of stroke; and analyze information on the incidence, severity, causes, outcomes, and rehabilitation of cardiac diseases.

Expected Outcome: The outcomes of the stoke registry are to analyze information on the incidence, severity, causes, outcomes, and rehabilitation of stroke; promote optimal care for stroke patients; alleviate unnecessary death and disability from a stroke; encourage the efficient and effective continuum of patient care, including prevention, pre-hospital care, hospital care, and rehabilitative care; and minimize the overall cost of stroke. The outcomes of a statewide cardiac registry will be to analyze information on the incidence, severity, causes, outcomes, and rehabilitation of cardiac diseases; promote optimal care for cardiac patients; alleviate unnecessary death and disability from cardiac diseases; encourage the efficient and effective continuum of patient care, including prevention, pre-hospital care, hospital care, and rehabilitative care; and minimize the overall cost of cardiac care.

Implementations and Resources: The bill will be implemented by the development of a stroke registry and a cardiac registry.

How: The activities will allow the Department to collect and analyze data and provide and consult on optimal care and outcomes for stroke and cardiac patients.
