Enactment of this bill could generate \$8,100 in ongoing General Fund revenue for the Lt. Governor's Office beginning in FY 2020 from civil fines issued to Political Action Committees which do not report contribution information in a timely manner.

Notes on Notes

The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
