To the extent that fewer individuals are fined for carrying a dangerous weapon while under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance, local governments could see reduced revenue of up to \$325 per occurrence.

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

To the extent that fewer individuals are fined for carrying a dangerous weapon while under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance, each individual could avoid charges of up to \$680 per occurrence.

Regulatory Impact UCA 36-12-13(2)(e)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
