This bill appropriates \$10.0 million from the General Fund to the Computer Science for Utah Grant Program established in the bill. Enactment of the legislation could also cost the Governor's Office of Economic Development \$150,000 ongoing from the General Fund for staff support to help with the implementation, administration and oversight of the grants and for creation and maintenance of the computer science education master plan.
