Enactment of this bill could cost the Department of Administrative Services \$10,300 one-time in FY 2020 from Dedicated Credits to replace the State of Utah flag at sites managed by the Division of Facilities Construction and Management . Enactment of this bill could cost the Utah National Guard \$9,000 one-time in FY 2020 from the General Fund to replace the State of Utah flag at facilities throughout the state. The Utah National Guard can absorb the costs within their existing budget.

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

For local governmental entities who publicly display the State of Utah flag, enactment of this bill could cost each entity \$40 to replace the current flag.

#### Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

For Individuals and Business who own and/or publicly display the State flag of Utah, enactment of this bill could cost each individual/business \$40 to replace the current flag.

#### Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(e)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
