Enactment of this bill could increase dedicated credit revenue to the Office of the Attorney General by \$567,900 in FY 2020 and \$116,100 ongoing beginning in FY 2021 for legal analysis and court time. Where applicable, this bill could have the following impacts to the following accounts by an unknown amount: (1) decrease to the Public Safety Restricted Account - \$32/applicant/instance for driver license renewal; (2) increase to Department of Corrections (DOC) dedicated credits - \$168/applicant for registry removal; (3) increase to DOC dedicated credits - \$25/applicant for an eligibility certificate; and (4) decrease to DOC dedicated credits - \$100/sex offender registrant/year.

Enactment of this bill could cost the DOC from the General Fund about \$885,000 in FY 2020 and \$408,200 each year thereafter. Cost breakdown is as follows: (1) \$317,100 in FY 2020 and \$292,100 ongoing in FY 2021 for database changes, research and compliance costs; and (2) \$567,900 in FY 2020 and \$116,100 ongoing to pay the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) for legal analysis and court time - this could correspondingly could cost OAG the same amount in dedicated credits over this time. In addition, this could cost the Department of Public Safety \$2,400 one-time from the Public Safety Restricted Account in FY 2019 for programming changes.
