Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that fewer individuals are convicted of class B misdemeanors as a result of this legislation, each case could decrease revenue to local governments by about \$330 from fines and fees. This legislation could also cost justice courts an unknown amount in processing costs.

To the extent that fewer individuals are convicted of class B misdemeanors as a result of this legislation, each individual could save \$680 from fines and fees. The total amount saved is unknown.
