Enactment of this legislation could increase revenue to the Commerce Service Account by \$15,000 annually from fees. When combined with the Commerce Service Account costs identified below, the year-end transfer to the General Fund from the Commerce Service Account could decrease by \$133,000 annually.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Department of Commerce \$148,000 annually from the Commerce Service Account to administer the regulatory sandbox program. Spending from the Commerce Service Account impacts the year-end transfer to the General Fund.
