UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

Enactment of this bill could increase ongoing revenue to the following accounts beginning in FY 2020: (1) General Fund \$900; and (2) Criminal Surcharge \$1,900.

Enactment of this bill could cost the Courts about \$6,800 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2020 for additional processing time in about 22 relevant cases a year.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this bill could increase fine revenue to local governments by about \$900 annually beginning in FY 2020. To the extent that offenders stay longer in jail as a result of this bill, this could cost county jails about \$70/day.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this bill could cost about 18 individuals about \$206 more in fines for a total of \$3,700 ongoing beginning in FY 2020.

Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(e)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

No performance note required for this bill

Notes on Notes

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
