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New Services or Benefit

Public Benefit:

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**Purpose:** The purposes and duties of the Department are to establish and administer Adult Autism Treatment Program Advisory Committee, make rules in collaboration with the advisory committee and account for funds received and distributed from the Adult Autism Treatment Account.

**Services:** The services provided by the funding increase include staff time for the Department to make rules in collaboration with the advisory committee; administration of the Adult Autism Treatment Advisory Committee to include staff time to facilitate quarterly meetings and allowable per diem for board members to attend quarterly meetings; and staff time for the Department to account for funds received and distributed through grant awards (grant awards are contingent on funds being received through gifts, grants, appropriations or donations).

**Expected Outcome:** The expected outcome of the new program is quarterly meetings with the Adult Autism Treatment Advisory Committee and accounting for grant funds received through gifts, grants, appropriations or donations and distributed to qualified providers.

**Implementations and Resources:** The bill will be implemented by utilizing Department staff to facilitate quarterly advisory committee meetings and accounting for funds received and distributed through the Adult Autism Treatment Account.

**How:** The proposed activities will ensure that the advisory committee has been established and funds are accounted for.
