Enactment of this legislation could cost a total of \$5,210,000 to the following agencies, from the General Fund ongoing beginning in FY 2021: (1) The Office of the Attorney General, \$232,000 for one mid-level FTE to manage increased workload; (2) The Courts, \$4,394,000 for appointments of visitors, attorneys, and professional evaluators, four FTE to manage appointed visitors, six FTE to manage appointed attorneys, additional hearings, review of guardian plans, and other court expenses; (3) The Office of Public Guardian, \$584,000 for appointments of additional guardians at litem and one FTE to manage emergency conservators and additional guardians ad litem. Enactment of this legislation could also cost the Courts \$36,000 one-time in FY 2020 to update the CORIS database.
