Enactment of this bill could cost the Department of Public Safety - Driver License Division about \$40 per case from the Transportation Fund Restricted - Public Safety Account for processing certain applicants seeking removal of ignition interlock restrictions beginning in FY 2020, however the total amount is unknown. The department reports that they can absorb these costs within current appropriations.
