Enactment of this legislation could cost the Office of Energy Development \$2,000 one-time in Fiscal Year 2019 and \$10,000 ongoing from the General Fund, beginning in Fiscal Year 2020, for personnel and administrative costs associated with administration of the Throughput Infrastructure Fund; the agency can absorb the costs. Enactment of this legislation could also result in a grant in the amount of approximately \$54,748,500 from the Throughput Infrastructure Fund to an interlocal agency.
