Enactment of this bill may cost the State Board of Education \$5,084,200 ongoing from the Education Fund to pay costs associated with implementing the school-level positive behavior plans outlined in the bill. This amount includes approximately \$4,280,000 to pay the \$3,000 teacher stipend and \$1,000 administrative cost for each school and \$804,200 to provide state administrative functions as outlined.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation requires public schools to develop and Local Boards of Education to adopt positive behavior plans for students. Bill provisions provide up to \$1,000 per school from the State to pay for the administrative functions associated with implementing this legislation.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses.

Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(e)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Notes on Notes
