Enactment of this legislation could reduce expenditures from the Department of Public Safety Restricted Account by about \$59,700 one-time in FY 2021 and \$119,400 ongoing beginning in FY 2022 for the Utah Highway Patrol to conduct about 1,085 fewer inspections of school buses in FY 2021 and 2,170 fewer inspections each year thereafter.
