Enactment of this legislation may result in increased costs to the State Board of Education beginning in FY 2021. The actual cost of this legislation is not known. Assuming a 5% increase in the number of students eligible for state-supported transportation in FY 2019 and a cost of \$600 per student for transportation, this legislation could cost a total of \$5,850,000 to support approximately 9,750 new students. The state currently covers approximately 75% of the cost of state-supported transportation. Assuming that the state would pay 75% of the total cost, enactment of this bill may cost the state approximately \$4,387,000 ongoing from the Education Fund.

# Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation may result in increased costs to local education agencies (LEAs) beginning in FY 2021. The actual cost of this legislation is not known. Assuming a 5% increase in the number of students eligible for state-supported transportation in FY 2019 and a cost of \$600 per student for transportation, this legislation could cost a total of \$5,850,000 to support approximately 9,750 new students. Local funds currently cover approximately 25% of the cost of state-supported transportation. Assuming that locals would pay 25% of the total cost, enactment of this bill may cost LEAs approximately \$1,463,000 ongoing. LEAs may also be required to purchase new school buses to accommodate the newly eligible students. New buses cost approximately \$100,000 each and are purchased with local funds. Costs associated with this bill may vary by LEA.

## Individuals & Businesses

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses

### **Regulatory Impact**

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

## Performance Note

The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
