Enactment of this legislation could cost the Department of Health \$333,400 one-time in FY 2021 from the General Fund. \$300,000 of the funds in FY 2021 are for grants to nonprofit organizations, with the remaining \$33,400 costs from personnel, office costs, and travel. Enactment of this legislation would also cost the Department of Health \$8,200 one-time in FY 2022 from the General Fund for personnel costs to monitor contracts and produce the yearly report. This bill appropriates \$300,000 from the General Fund one-time in FY 2021 to cover a portion of these costs.
