Enactment of this legislation could cost the Department of Health \$8,500 ongoing from the General Fund in Fiscal Year 2021. Enactment could also cost the Department of Human Services \$2,100 ongoing from the General Fund and \$300 in Federal Funds ongoing in Fiscal Year 2021; the Department of Human Services has indicated they can absorb these costs. Enactment could also cost the Department of Human Services \$306,000 ongoing from federal funds in Fiscal Year 2021 to develop and manage a program to reduce substance abuse during pregnancy.
