Enactment of this legislation could cost the Legislature \$27,700 (\$9,600 to the Senate, \$9,600 to the House of Representatives, and \$8,500 to Legislative Research and General Counsel) from the General Fund one-time in FY 2021 for compensation and expense reimbursement for members of the new Outdoor Adventure Commission. Enactment could also cost the Legislature \$375,000 from the General Fund one-time in FY 2021 for consultants as outlined in the legislation.
