**Local Government**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this bill could reduce local justice courts costs by an unknown amount for fewer cases processed and corresponding ongoing revenue of about \$4,500. This could also increase costs to local governments for prosecution and incarceration costs by \$70/day/offender.

**Individuals & Businesses**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

About 87 individuals annually could pay an additional \$1,230 in fines for a total of \$107,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2021.

**Regulatory Impact**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

**Notes on Notes**

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
