Enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Health from the General Fund \$800 one-time in FY 2020 for programming costs and \$76,900 ongoing beginning in FY 2021 to pay for 750 ultrasounds annually and 0.2 FTEs. The Department of Health has indicated that it can absorb the one-time costs.

**Local Government**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this bill could increase revenue to local governments up to \$100,000/case for fines. This bill could also cost justice courts an unknown amount in court processing costs.

**Individuals & Businesses**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that physicians violate provisions of this bill, this could cost certain offenders up to \$100,000/case, however the total amount is unknown.

**Regulatory Impact**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation could result in a medium increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

**Notes on Notes**

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
